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Dear Parents

In the light of advice from government and Public Health England (PHE) we want to assure you that we are responding to Covid 19 in a sensible and measured way and as directed by the local authority. A team at Norfolk Children's Services is in the process of drawing up an action plan for all schools and we will share this with you as soon as we receive it. In the meantime this advice/information for parents has been sent to all headteachers from Educate Norfolk.

If your child is showing signs of illness, specifically

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough,

then the advice from the NHS is to stay at home and self-isolate for 7 days.

Any absence due to this illness will be authorised. If you decide to keep your child at home when they are not ill, the decision to authorise/unauthorise will be judged on individual circumstances, so please state these clearly when reporting absence. We cannot make this decision for you, but advise you to phone 111 if you need any specific or further advice.

You should:

- try to keep at least 2 metres (3 steps) from other people in your home, particularly older people or those with long-term health conditions
- ask friends and family and delivery services to deliver things like food shopping and medicines – but avoid contact with them
- sleep alone if possible
- regularly wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- try to stay away from older people and those with long-term health conditions
- drink plenty of water and take everyday painkillers, such as paracetamol and ibuprofen, to help with your symptoms



Please remember, for self-isolation, you should not leave the house for the entire 7 day period.

Can we also insist that all children bring their own water bottle each day, as we will not be using the water fountains as a precautionary measure. These will be covered and a 'not in use' sign put up.

If you would like to send your child in with hand sanitiser as an additional measure, then please ensure this is labelled with their name so it can be kept securely in the classroom. All classes will have boxes of tissues available. These will be used and binned. Cleaning staff will empty these daily as well as cleaning and sanitising door handles etc.

All trips and activities will be risk assessed as they arise and a decision made as to whether they go ahead.

Many thanks to you all for maintaining a sensible and measured approach. We will continue to follow the advice from the DfE, LA and PHE and will inform you of any changes as they occur.
